He works with individuals and across a diverse spectrum of sectors including creative industries, charities, education, arts and performance. Prior to that, Hydar worked for two years providing technical support for Microsoft's Online Advertising and four years as IT Support Manager, configuring, deploying and integrating webbased editorial systems for daily newspapers. Before moving to the UK, he worked for two years as Systems Developer at Dubai Ports, Customs and Free Zone Authority.
